Christ the King and Good Shepherd

THEME: God exalts those who care for and minister to

the poor and the needy.

WORD: Ez 34:11-12,15-17 ~ Ps 23:1-2,2-3,5-6

1 Cor 15:20-26,28 ~ Mt 25:31-46

ORDER: **Look after and tend my sheep.** – cf Ez34:11

Whatever you do for one of the least brothers of mine, you do for me. - cf Mt 25:40

REFLECTION:

Out Church presents us with a beautiful vision of the coming of Jesus Christ, seated in glory on His throne with all the angels around Him and all the nations of the earth gathered before Him. And we hear our Lord's message: "Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the Kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world!" (Mt 25:34) This is the great promise of our faith and our hope to hear these words personally from Jesus Christ.

The first reading is a powerful prophecy by Ezekiel over 500 years before Christ came on earth. Christ fulfilled this prophecy to the letter. He is the Good Shepherd Who said: "I will deliver them from every place where they were scattered on the day of dark clouds...The lost I will search out, the strays I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, and the sick I will heal." (Ez 34:16) Jesus is the Good Shepherd Who tends His flock. He feeds them before He eats. He notices each one and immediately binds up any of their wounds.Continued on page 2

Promise of the Week

"The lost I will search out, the strays I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, and the sick I will heal." (Ez 34:16a) The following is a reflection on the weekend from a member of the sponsoring class, ME 48. Perhaps for many of us, it will stir many similar fond memories of the encounters we have been blessed to have been a part of.

The **ME** Works!

Simply put, the ME works, because we have lived it.

As I was gazing into my husband's eyes during the song presentations of our class in BLD Newark's recent Marriage Encounter Weekend, I was transported back to being a candidate again, sitting in front, and closely watching how the ME 47 shepherds and the couples of their class were tenderly touching and looking at each other. Six months ago, I had whispered to myself, "I want that." Thanks to last weekend's ME, I was that to the candidates of ME 49 who were sitting before us.

"One thing I ask of the Lord; this I seek: to dwell in the Lord's house all the days of my life, to gaze on the Lord's beauty, to visit His temple." (Ps 27:4) This verse took on a matrimonial meaning for me. We are called to live in our homes with our earthly spouses all the days of our lives; to gaze at his or her beauty and to be close to and intimate with them. In a sense, our love here is a prelude for a greater love; it points to the qualities of that relationship. When we have a passion for God, then we will feel the most love for our spouses. Saturated in these loves, from our Divine Father and our earthly spouse, we open up to loving others. Then we begin to love our friends, enemies and strangers too, seeing in them Christ, Who will complete the good work He has started in each followers from the pretenders and unbelievers. Each of of us (cf Phil 1:6).

During ME 49, how great it was to be touched once more by Msgr. Paul Schetelick's stories of loving couples and their children; to hear the stories of God's love victorious in the lives of the sharers. Like saints, like Christ, there is no greater witness than when people give of their lives.

As ME 48 completes our six months, although we are like babies still in an early developmental stage: we can stand with the support of the Community and energetically serve. At the ME, we responded, smiling and happy, with our spouses and with the others in BLD. Praise God!

He heals the sick by giving them His love and attention. As the psalmist proclaims, He is the Shepherd Who leads us to rich pastures and restful waters.

Matthew's Gospel says Jesus' Kingly glory will be visible to men at His second coming. Jesus foretold what was going to happen at the end of time.



"He will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before Him. And He will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left." (Mt 25:31~33)

On judgment day, God will separate His obedient us will stand before Christ's tribunal and see our life's work laid bare. We shall see our thoughts, words and actions; our prejudices, pride, selfishness, our sins, and most of all, how we have treated others. In the presence of the Omniscient Judge, we will see ourselves as we truly are.

THE WRITING ON THE WALL

A couple of years ago, a friend of mine gave me a nice coffee table book, and in it were New Yorker magazine cartoons from the various decades of the 20th century. I found their subtle humor amusing, although I couldn't comprehend some of them, mostly those from the early 1900's. And then, when I was about midway through the book, I saw the cartoon below and found myself excitedly laughing, because... I got it! Thanks to BLD's Word Sharing Circles, I vividly remembered talking about the reading from Daniel with the same words: MENE, TEKEL and PERES. (Dn 5:25)



In the story from that Book of Daniel, during a royal party, where the guests were using treasures plundered from the temple in Jerusalem, a hand suddenly appeared, writing those words on a palace wall. Later that night, the host of the party, King Belshazzar, was slain. Since the New Yorker cartoon was showing traders looking at a stock market big board and ticker, its artist must have been depicting the scene just before a Wall Street crash. It made me recall when I used to work for a Wall Street bank and there was panic aplenty whenever there was a huge correction.

Had it not been for BLD and our Word Sharing Circles, I probably would not have ever noticed this reading when read at Mass. But beyond the intellectual stimulation of understanding the New Yorker cartoonist's message, lies the more real lesson of "The Writing on the Wall" (which is where, I believe the English expression actually comes from). As we declare Him King, may we all realize that Christ's second coming is inevitable.

The lesson for everyone is to be ready now. Do good now; believe in Him, now. For ignoring M-T-P, thinking that one can just scramble later, will, sadly, have its consequences.

But behind everything must be our stand to acknowledge the Kingship of Christ. As St. Paul says, He must reign in us. He must be at the core of our private and public life, our individual and social life, our economic and political life. And that means, not merely as a sentiment or feeling, but in principle and as a way of life. We need to ask for the grace to offer our hearts to Jesus Christ, enthroning Him at the center of everything in our lives, to strive for holiness and to acquire the resolve to do God's will.

The Feast of Christ the King extols us to bring to the world the beauty of God's Kingdom. We do this through the way we live, by sharing with the men and women of our time, our faith and the teachings of the Gospel and the teachings of our Church. Let us never forget that Jesus Christ is the King Who came among us as a Servant. He came to serve, not to be served. This is what Jesus is saying in today's Gospel. He is asking us to make simple acts of charity and deeds of mercy: to do corporal works of mercy in all circumstances. They are simple acts freely given and freely received. We have no excuse to neglect those in deep need. Jesus really lays it on the line when He says, "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." (Mt 25:40) We're to show that we are caring persons by the witness of our actions. As a Community, we must witness unity of heart, mind and spirit in sharing a common vision and mission, based on Christian love and faith, service and worship, within itself and with the bigger Church. Serve the poor and the underprivileged, by supporting campaigns for human development, participating in such critical areas as social and poverty alleviation endeavors, housing and medical missions. Evangelize individuals and families and build communities of faith through renewal programs, such as Encounters, LSS and Discipleship Formation programs; and to provide formation on personal prayer, pro-life values and Catholic social teachings and stewardship.

In keeping with our Worship theme tonight which says that **God exalts those who care for and minister to the poor and the needy**, let us ask for the grace to do this joyfully. Because as we live our daily lives and try to understand and help others by going out of our way to make life better for them, we do it in imitation of Jesus. So let us pray today for the grace to be faithful servants of Jesus Christ our King. Nothing in our lives, my brothers and sisters, should be more important than loving and following Jesus!
