Pope at Audience: Walking according to the Spirit makes us free

Pope Francis concludes his General Audience catechetical series on the Letter to the Galatians highlighting how the Apostle Paul teaches that "the fulfillment of the true Law is found in this life of the Spirit given to us by Jesus." And the life of the Spirit "can only be lived in freedom".

Speaking to pilgrims gathered in the Paul VI Hall in the Vatican for Wednesday's General Audience, Pope Francis noted that Saint Paul's Letter to the Galatians shows his role as a great evangeliser, theologian, and pastor. He pointed out how he helps us discover "the shocking newness contained in the revelation of Jesus Christ", contemplating the mystery of Christ and sharing it with "creative intelligence" with those to whom he preached.

At the same time, he ably guided and encouraged a lost and confused community at the time with great pastoral sensitivity, the Pope observed, showing how the strength of the Spirit had "truly entered his heart" and how his meeting with the Risen Christ transformed his entire life.

Defending the freedom of Christ

The Pope emphasised the passion Saint Paul showed in defending the freedom that Christ brought - a passion that "still moves us today". With great conviction, Paul

REFLECTION:

This This Sunday's Gospel depicts a frightening scenario at the end of time. Imagine: *"the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky and the powers in the heavens will be shaken,"* (Mk 13:24-25). It may seem scary, but in reality, it is a joyous occasion because finally, we *"will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory..."* (Mk 13:26).



As we approach the end of the Church's liturgical year, this reading is a fitting reminder and a challenge for all of us to be ready for that unpredictable day. *"But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father,"* (Mk 13:32). Should we fear the end of time? Our loving God, in His Word, tells us not to be afraid. Instead, He admonishes us to be vigilant and to continue to trust that

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responded to the call he received to preach the Gospel, the Pope went on to say.

Saint Paul pointed out to the Galatians that they, too, were called to the freedom that liberates them from every form of slavery by making them heirs of the ancient promise and children of God through Christ. Summing up what Paul teaches, the Pope said, "The fulfillment of the true Law is found in this life of the Spirit given to us by Jesus. And this life of the Spirit can only be lived in freedom: Christian freedom."

Walking according to the Spirit

Summing up this catechetical journey on the Letter to the Galatians, the Pope said the Apostle's teaching generates enthusiasm, being drawn to follow the way of freedom and "to walk according to the Spirit", which always makes us free.

At the same time, he noted, we become more aware of our weaknesses as we see how challenging it is to be "docile to the Spirit, to surrender to His beneficial action". But we cannot let discouragement set in, the Pope said, recalling the Gospel episode of the disciples in the boat at the moment of the storm, when the Apostles woke Christ up to save them. In these very difficult moments of life, we need to "wake up Christ who is within us", adding, "We must rouse Christ in our hearts and only then will we be able to contemplate things with His eyes for He sees beyond the storm".

Calling on the Holy Spirit

In conclusion, the Pope said we should never grow weary of doing good, and we can always trust the Spirit will come to assist us in our weakness and give us the support we need. Therefore, we need to "learn to invoke the Holy Spirit more often", he said, and one of the great ways to do that is to recite often "the beautiful prayer" the Church recites on Pentecost: "Come, Holy Spirit".

With the presence of the Spirit, the Pope said, "we will protect our freedom", since "Christian freedom is what makes us grow" and makes true joy come forth.

Once More about Disciples' Privilege

If you've been in BLD for a while, you've probably already heard some members refer to "disciples' privilege." Loosely defined, it's what many of us attribute answered prayers to. And the petitions range from truly serious requests to other, seemingly, more trivial things.

Over the fifteen plus years that I've been with the community, I've become convinced that God sends such blessings to many in BLD. Although I don't think that anyone has ever fully documented them, most of us probably know some of those who've told about their experience of disciples' privilege.

Sometimes, He has His angels work overtime, such as when early one year, a close friend of ours from our ME class received a stage 4, extremely rare, cancer diagnosis. And then, after months of intense treatment was declared cancer free within the same year!

At other times simpler, more mundane mini-miracles occur. These stories include times when a spot suddenly materializes in a crowded parking lot after a quick prayer petition for it to happen.

Once, after a tiring, sweat-filled morning of yardwork, I sat down in the shade for some rest and to have a drink of water. I wasn't expecting it, but it seems that one of the Lord's angels arranged for a soft, silent, and refreshing breeze to blow my way. I had to smile, thinking that although it could have just been a coincidence, that somehow it must have been disciples' privilege at work once again.

It's easy to think that somehow, these small things just happen, especially when life's many other noises overwhelm our senses, preventing us from recognizing the blessings that God, through His angels, sends our way. Unfortunately, the sensitivity to His goodness doesn't come naturally. It seems that we actually have to train our senses to be on the lookout for them, so that we'd be able to hear, see, smell, taste, and feel His presence. We have to be more acutely aware, first physically, as in our brains registering an awareness of the blessings, and then, afterwards, by planting conscious seeds of gratitude in our hearts. Then, the gratitude to God will grow and will be there all the time.

May He continue to bless us all in our beloved BLD Community!

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He will never forsake us. There are times when we experience problems which seem to be unbearable, that make us feel hopeless, as if it is the end of our world. Remember how God in His goodness and love, always manifests His presence and refuge. God is always in control no matter what the situation may be. He is completely in charge. We are called to strengthen our relationship with the Lord, striving for the things that lasts eternally. Our life on earth must be spent as a faith journey, following everything that our Lord Jesus Christ teaches us. This is the way to be vigilant, preparing for that time when all of us will be judged before Jesus if we have truly loved God and our neighbors.

We are blessed to be active members in the renewal Community as we are given the opportunity to vigilantly prepare for the coming of our Lord Jesus, King of the Universe. Our daily prayers (rosary, Divine Mercy chaplet and intercession), weekly Corporate Worships, word sharing, Holy Masses, reflections on His Word and service to our needy and poor brethren financially and spiritually – all these give us an assurance that, every day, we have the chance to be in the presence of our Holy God.
