PRESS ON

When we are told that a loved one is “in recovery,” we often breathe a sigh of relief. It’s a “Thank God” moment because it means that someone dear to us has gone through an event or a period of time that was difficult or painful or scary (or maybe it was all of those things) and is now coming out the other side. Thank God.

It’s just the way life is. And sooner or later, everyone we know will spend time recovering from something.

- From a stay in the hospital
- From an addiction
- From a financial setback
- From an accident
- From the grief of losing a loved one
- From a storm or a natural disaster

Everyone suffers, and the scars can take a long time to heal. A friend once told me that some things cause such a dramatic change in our lives that we can never really get over it; we just get used to it. I think it must be like that for anyone who suffers a great loss. I don’t know what it feels like to see your child critically injured in an accident, or to have to evacuate your home in a storm, or to be diagnosed with a terminal illness. But I do know what it feels like to lose your husband after 50 years of doing just about everything together. Life-changing events like these often leave us feeling like victims, carrying a hurt that never completely goes away.

In [Philippians 3:13-14](#), St. Paul tells us how he deals with suffering and loss. ***“One thing I do, forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.”*** He presses on.

“Press On” is a song by Daniel L. Burgess that beautifully echoes St. Paul’s message of encouragement.

“When the valley is deep
When the mountain is steep
When the body is weary
When we stumble and fall

When the choices are hard
When we’re battered and scarred
When we’ve spent our resources
When we’ve given our all

In Jesus’ name, we press on
In Jesus’ name, we press on
Dear Lord, with the prize
Clear before our eyes
We find the strength to press on”

The process of recovery may be slow and exhausting, but Jesus tells us, **“to pray always and not lose heart”** ([Luke 18:1](#)). Some translations of that verse say, never lose hope; don’t be discouraged; never give up. Our strength and our hope are in Jesus. He knows what suffering and sorrow feel like, but He urges us to press on and never give up. Jesus doesn’t just **know** the way; He **is** the Way. And if we let Him, He will lovingly lead us **“out of darkness into his marvelous light”** ([1Peter 2:9](#)). With His help, we press on.

I smiled when she said, “It’s a random Bible verse,” because I knew that neither one of us believes in coincidences. And it was no coincidence that the “random Bible verse” I chose gave me the inspiration I needed to press on and finish writing this reflection. **“Never give up.”** Thanks, Angela.

The love of God purifies us to a life of holiness. Jesus came to purify us of everything that distance us from God. He brought salvation to mankind by conquering death and sin at the cross. Holiness is a disposition of the heart that makes us humble and obedient to God's precepts. It allows us to respond to the call of Jesus to follow Him as His disciples to bring more people to Him, to be kind, merciful and forgiving, and above all to love as He loves us. God delights in reshaping our character so that we reflect His holiness more and more each day. As we face the challenges that test our faith, our best response is to hold fast to God's holiness, wisdom, and love. It is only through His Spirit that we can find the power we need to become holy as Jesus is holy. We are given this direction: ***"Trust***

in the Lord, whose hope is the Lord" (Jer 17:7). We can stay close to the Lord with His light upon us, so that others may see His holiness in what we say and do, thus giving Him glory.

For the month of February, our weekly themes provide us some insights on how we will be able to walk in holiness in our love for God and others.

On the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, our theme is – **We are purified to be holy when we commit to a life of worship, prayer, and sacrifice.** The presentation of Jesus is for us the fulfillment of God's covenant of love, the truth and hope of man. He is now the way to the Father, the path to a fulfilled life in God's sight, the road to living in the image of God we were created to be. Jesus is the hope of eternal life for all. His presentation shows that He is the truth of who we are, what we have become and what we can be. Thus, our faith journey will be assured of more graces to embrace a life of worship in all that we do, anchored in prayer and sacrifices, and proclaim this promise, ***"Refining them like gold or like silver... will please the Lord."*** (Mal 3: 3b, 4a)

For the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time, our theme is – **We are purified to be holy when we preach and witness to the word of God.** To be evangelizers of the Gospel and teachings of Jesus is probably a daunting task for many. It requires a change in one's outlook and priorities in life. Like Peter, the initial response might be doubt and fear. But because we have committed to do the mission of Jesus as His true disciples, we must be willing to listen and obey. Above all we must trust in Him and ***"not be afraid"*** (Lk 5:10b). Our commission "to be fishers of men" is a great calling and therefore, God will provide us with all graces and means to fulfill it. God will always fill up what is lacking in us as His disciple and be true to His promise, ***"The Lord will complete what he has done for me; your kindness, O Lord, endures forever..."*** (Ps 138:8)

For the 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time, our theme is – **We are purified to be holy when we do acts of charity.** The Beatitudes is the perfect way to know the heart of Jesus as He preached to those who are close to God and who will inherit His Kingdom. He teaches that true wealth is not measured by what we have in this world, but by how much care we give for the last, the least and the lost. As children of God, we are called to alleviate the suffering of the poor. So that we too may be blessed, we must be righteous before God in our willingness to serve and be kind, motivated by the love of Christ that we experience in our own life. When we recognize the marginalized, the poor, the under-privileged, those who are suffering injustice, and we empathize with them, we will share in God's promise, ***"Behold, your reward will be great in heaven,"*** (Lk 6:23).

For the 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time, our theme is – **We are purified to be holy when we are forgiving to those who have wronged us.** To forgive your enemies, those who have wronged you even if you have done nothing to deserve it, those who have needlessly wounded your feelings, those who do not deserve your sympathy – to love these people is the most difficult thing one is asked to do. But this is the definition of God’s love and the ultimate measure of true love. Our greatest model in forgiving is Jesus. He prayed for those who had nailed him to the cross: **“Father, forgive them; they do not know what they are doing,”** (Lk 23:34). As we end this month of love, we are invited by Jesus to **“be merciful, just as your Father is merciful,”** (Lk 6:36). And as we practice the virtue of forgiveness in our personal and community life, we are always assured of God’s promise, **“He pardons all your iniquities, heals all your ills. He redeems your life from destruction, crowns you with kindness and compassion.”** (Ps 103:2, 4)

Prayer, Worship, and Sacrifice



The Gospel of Luke recounts the story of the Holy Family's obedience to Jewish law, including Mary's purification and Jesus' presentation in the Temple. Mary, like any new mother, was considered ritually unclean after childbirth (per Leviticus), and so, she remained secluded for 40 days, even though she was, by no means, guilty of any sin or impurity. For her ritual purification, she had to offer up a lamb for sacrifice, but she and Joseph were not rich and could only afford a pair of turtle doves or two young pigeons, the offering of the poor. ***"It is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord'"*** (Lk 2:23). Jesus was

consecrated because every firstborn son “belongs” to the Lord recalling Abraham’s offering Isaac to be sacrificed. We should note that Jesus, in reality, did not need consecration because He already belonged to God. But it was required of every firstborn male Jew who will need to be redeemed referencing the first Passover when all of

Pharaoh's people's firstborn sons were killed by the destroying angel but all of Israel's firstborn sons were spared and thus *redeemed* (*Exodus 13*). Joseph and Mary would have paid five silver shekels, the price for redemption as fixed in the book of Numbers 18.

On a typical day in the Temple, many families would have come for similar rituals, and there was nothing out of the ordinary about this family. But this day was extraordinary! Luke singles out two people from the multitudes present in the temple area that day: Simeon and Anna. Both were drawn to the Holy Family, and guided by the Holy Spirit, they recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah, the consolation and redemption of Israel. Simeon took the baby Jesus into his arms as a rabbi would and blessed God. But he foresaw the shadow of the cross, "***a sign that will be contradicted***" (*Lk 2:34*) and the sword of sorrow which would pierce Mary, foreseeing the lance that pierced Jesus side. Anna witnessed all this and thanked God. Then she proclaimed the arrival of the Savior of the world into human history.

It was an extraordinary day in salvation history because it marked the fulfillment of ancient prophecies, including that of the prophet Malachi. "***Suddenly there will come to the temple the LORD whom you seek, And the messenger of the covenant whom you desire. Yes, he is coming, says the LORD of hosts***" (*Mal 3:1*). In prior generations, the sins of Israel had become so great that there was much indifference and a severe disconnection from God. Things got so bad that Ezekiel said, during the Babylonian exile, that the glory of God got up and left the Temple. The people needed to be reconciled to God before His Glory can return. The return of God's glory to the Temple came, not as a cloud as people expected but as a baby, the Word Incarnate in human flesh.

The gospel and the readings highlight our constant need to be reconciled to God, which Jesus came to foster. Simeon and Anna's recognition of Jesus emphasizes the importance of worship, prayer, and sacrifice in awaiting Christ's Second Coming. As disciples of Christ, we are called to holiness, to lives of prayer, worship, and sacrifice, imitating Simeon and Anna's humility, obedience, and faithfulness. We welcome Jesus, who is the *refiner's fire*. As is promised, refining us *like gold or silver... will please the Lord*. To be purified, to become holy, "we are to live our lives offering *due sacrifice* and giving *right praise* to God which means re-ordering our lives appropriately towards God and living lives that prioritize God above all else. It involves the commitment to change one's life to reflect God's will, rather than our own will or the will of the world.



Most especially, it is essential that we participate in the celebration of the Eucharist. Every Mass recall Jesus' presentation in the Temple and His Real Presence among us. At Mass, our prayers, worship, and sacrifice remain focused on Jesus, who made the supreme sacrifice by dying on the cross. The Holy Spirit brings divinity face to face with humanity as Jesus' body and blood are re-presented in the Eucharist. Jesus' Real Presence joins us in our humanity because He is our merciful and faithful High Priest.

We've realized our Friday praise and worships are a blessing, for we are given the opportunity to give due honor and praise to our Messiah and Redeemer, whose life was the ultimate sacrificial offering that opened the gates of heaven for us. In our BLD community, we encourage everyone to go to Mass and come to praise and worship. And that is a good spiritual marker for all of us to see that our community offers us a guidepost, which shows us how to order our lives to be ones of prayer, worship, and sacrifice until this becomes the normative path to follow. Our mission in community must be to offer up to God this way of life, this discipleship that we live out in faithfulness to the Lord by following Him, by offering prayers, by offering praise and worship and sacrifice *all the time!*

And that's what it means to live the called-to-be-holy lifestyle that Jesus taught us and to do it 24/7. Amen.
